



SCHOOL & DISTRICT PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

Program Package, Access Terms & Perkins V Alignment Statement

AI-WISE Community Program (2627001) · IOLEBA Guild & Assembly · 2026–27 Edition

This document sets forth the program package structure, participant access terms, data privacy architecture, and Perkins V (Section 135) funding alignment under which IOLEBA, LLC (“IOLEBA”) provides the AI-WISE Community Program to partnering school districts, local educational agencies (LEAs), and career and technical education (CTE) programs. It is intended for review by district administrators, workforce development officers, procurement officers, and federal or state grant reviewers.

This Agreement reflects IOLEBA’s updated program offer, effective September 1, 2026.

A limited number of implementation opportunities remain available for the 2026–2027 academic year.

1. Program Package & Participant Capacity

IOLEBA delivers the AI-WISE Community Program under a fixed program package structure. Each package provides participant access for a defined capacity and includes advance training access for a set number of instructors. No per-student or per-participant unit pricing applies to Options 1–3.

Program Package	Included Access
Option 1 — Up to 50 Participants	\$1,250.00 — 2 instructor accounts. Minimum package purchase: 50 participants.
Option 2 — Up to 100 Participants	\$2,500.00 — 4 instructor accounts.
Option 3 — Up to 150 Participants	\$3,750.00 — 6 instructor accounts.
Option 4 — Custom Enrollment (More Than 150 Participants)	Districts enrolling more than 150 participants may expand the 150-participant package at \$25.00 for each additional participant. Two additional instructor accounts are included for each additional group of up to 50 participants. IOLEBA will provide a customized invoice based on the district’s confirmed enrollment. Example: a district enrolling 175 participants would pay \$3,750 for the 150-participant package plus \$625 for 25 additional participants, for a total of \$4,375.

Option 1 requires a minimum package purchase of 50 participants. The school or district may enroll participants up to the capacity of the purchased package, or, under Option 4, the confirmed enrollment count invoiced by IOLEBA. Unused participant capacity does not carry forward into another academic year, and the package does not renew automatically. Continued participation in a later academic year requires the school or district to select and purchase a new program package.

Adult and staff learners participating in the instructional program count toward the district’s purchased participant capacity. Instructor accounts included with each package are provided for program administration, training, and instructional support and do not count against the purchased participant capacity.

2. Payment & Implementation Timeline

- To support an October 1 implementation, payment and required account information should be received no later than September 20. Later enrollments may receive a later activation date based on the approximately ten-day setup period described below.
- IOLEBA requires approximately 10 calendar days following payment and receipt of required information to establish the school account.
- Instructors included with the selected package receive advance access during the account-establishment period so they can complete program preparation and training before participant access begins.
- Suggested participant access period: October 1 through July 1 of the same academic year.
- All payments are final and non-refundable. There is no automatic renewal.

4. IOLEBA Student Data Privacy Commitment

IOLEBA’s instructional tools are designed to minimize the collection and transmission of participant personal information. The instructional activities do not require participants to submit personally identifiable information to third-party cloud-based generative-AI services. Actual data handling depends on the account, website, email, analytics, and other technologies enabled by IOLEBA and the participating district.

Each participating school or district remains responsible for reviewing and approving technologies in accordance with its own privacy, security, FERPA, and COPPA obligations, and for determining any notices or consents it requires.

5. Perkins V Section 135 Alignment

IOLEBA Program 2627001 is designed to support potential allowable uses under Perkins V Section 135. Final eligibility and funding determinations remain with the participating school district and its grant administrator, and are subject to the district’s Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment, approved local application, and applicable federal, state, and local requirements. The table below identifies specific IOLEBA program activities that a district may evaluate against the corresponding Section 135(b) authorized use; it is not a determination of eligibility.

§135(b)(3) — Skills necessary to pursue high-skill, high-wage or in-demand careers	Modules 4–14: hands-on practice with client-side AI tools, workflow automation, and entrepreneurial business skills.
§135(b)(4) — Integration of academic skills into CTE programs	The 14-module textbook sequence integrates academic reference material, defined terms, and applied CTE skill-building within a single curriculum.
§135(b)(5) — CTE program implementation, including technology, instructional materials, simulated work environments, employability skills and industry partnerships	The local-edge instructional platform, module textbooks and tools, and the student “Pretend Business” simulated work environment, together with embedded employability-skills content.
§135(b)(6) — Program evaluation	A 50-question self-evaluation quiz in each module and the biweekly Assembly checkpoint provide ongoing data a district may use for program evaluation.

6. Procurement Considerations

Proprietary Program Characteristics

IOLEBA Program 2627001 includes proprietary instructional content, methodologies, and practical tools. These characteristics may assist a district in evaluating the appropriate procurement method. Each district remains responsible for determining and documenting compliance with its applicable federal, state, local, and institutional procurement requirements. Nothing in this document constitutes a determination that a noncompetitive procurement method is authorized for a particular district purchase.

Federal Grant Procurement Alignment (2 CFR § 200.320)

For purchases made using federal Perkins V funds, districts should evaluate this program against the Uniform Guidance procurement standards at 2 CFR § 200.320. Depending on the package selected and the district’s applicable purchasing thresholds, a purchase may qualify for simplified procurement treatment. Districts must confirm their current federal, state, local, and institutional requirements.

7. Program Scope

- The 14-module AI-WISE school program remains separate from any optional adult IOLEBA program.
- No commercial membership offers appear within the participant-facing school program.
- The IOLEBA Learning Arcade and IOLEBA Language Learning Community are separate marketing demonstrations and are not included in, or part of, this Agreement.
- Community adult discount memberships and IOLEBA Entrepreneur Program memberships are not included with this program package.

8. General Terms

8.1 Intellectual Property

All curriculum content, software frameworks, and client-side tools remain the exclusive intellectual property of IOLEBA, LLC.

8.2 Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.
